DA Ernest Rell Asks Law Of Arrest Work At First Opportunity

District Attorney S. Ernest Roll said today that he had addressed a letter to Governor Goodwin J. Knight on June 1 requesting that the Governor add matters concerning the proposed revision of the Law of Arrest to the first special session of the California State Leg-

Roll advised the governor that as a result of the Cahan decision he feels that certain legislation should be enacted at the earliest possible opportunity in connection with the following subjects:

The Law of Arrest. 2. The law on the subject of search warrants which would modernize the procedure in obtaining the same and yet provide adequate Constitutional guar-

3. Legislation fixing a time for motions to suppress evidence in criminal cases alleged to have been illegally obtained in violation of Constitutional rights.

Pointing out to the governor his reason for the request for emergency legislation, Roll advised him that the Supreme Court of California in adopting the exclusionary rule of evidence, did not set forth guides to aid the law enforcement officers in determining when an arrest is reasonable and when it is unreasonable, nor did it set forth any rule which trial courts may follow in determining the admissibility of evidence obtained by search and seizures.

In connection with his move to obtain emergency legislation along the above lines, District Attorney Roll also wrote letters to several Assemblymen and Senators suggesting that the matter might be added to any special call of the Legislature. Roll said that he had been assured by Attorney General Edmund G. Brown that he favored early action on legislation concerning the Law of Arrest and other matters mentioned in the letter to the Governor.

ORDINANCE NO. 6690

An ordinance adding Section 418 to Ordinance No. 1494, the Zoning Ordinance No. 6042, thereby adding the Littlerock Zoning District.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 418 is added to Ordinance No. 1494 entitled "An ordinance providing for the creation in the unincorporated area of the County of Los Angeles of zones and prescribing area requirements and classes of uses of buildings, structures, improvements and premises in said several zones," adopted September 12, 1927, to read:

SECTION 418. LITTLEROCK DISTRICT NO. 1017.

The respective portions of that certain part of the unincorporated territory known as and hereby designated as "Littlerock" (District No. 107) are hereby placed within those certain zones shown on that certain zoning map entitled "Precise Plan, Littlerock District No. 107," which said map is attached hereto and made a part hereof and referred to for a particular description of each portion of the said district.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 6042 entitled "An ordinance establishing area requirements in the Littlerock Creek Irrigation District, declaring the urgency thereof and that this ordinance shall take immediate effect," adopted August 19, 1952, is repealed.


In so far as the provisions of Section 418 of said Ordinance No. 1494 imposes the same or lesser area requirements than imposed by said Ordinance No. 6042, such provisions shall be construed as restatements and continuations and not as new enactments. Section 3. This ordinance shall be published in South Antelope Valley Press, a newspaper printed and published in the County of Los Angeles.
